The Games and Recreation Committee of the Student Center is hosting the ACU-I Region VI Games Tournament this

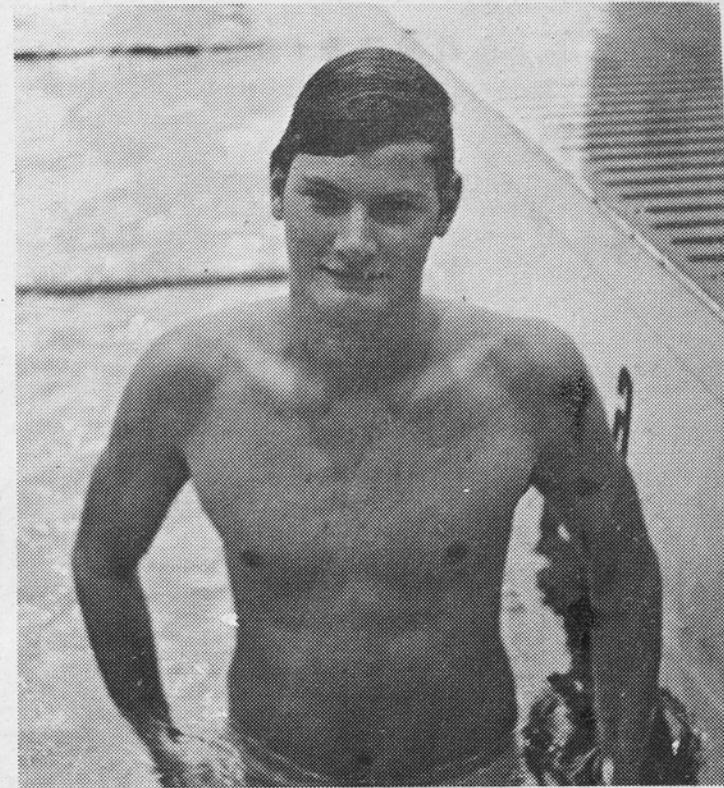
to the fact that the Jacket swimming program simply cannot compete with schools who carry full scholarship athletes. In spite of this fact, this year's squad is the strongest in recent years, with almost all of the Tech record holders currently on the team.

One example of the talent available to the Jackets is freshman Dick Bergmarck. In the first ten meets, Bergmarck has broken Freshman and Varsity records in the 500, 1000 and 1650 yard Freestyle and the 400 yard Individual Medley. Although he was offered full scholarships to swim for Kansas, Oklahoma, and Arkansas; Dick chose Tech on a partial scholarship because of its fine national reputation. This illustrates the ability of Tech to draw fine athletes, even without financial aid, although this is

the exception rather than the rule.

Other standouts on the squad are senior utility man Steve Heck, who holds Tech records in the 200-yard Breaststroke, 200-yard Individual Medley, and the 100-yard Butterfly. He is also a member of the four swimmers who set the record for the 400-yard and 800-yard freestyle medley relays, Senior Ed Kenehen holds the 200-yard butterfly record and junior Chuck Marmor claims the 100-yard, and 200-yard backstroke records.

Backing them up are team stalwarts such as Jan Gripp, Harry McCance and John Fauerbach. The coach of this year's squad is veteran coach J. Herbie McCauley, who, like many other Tech coaches, is a former Tech student and graduate.
